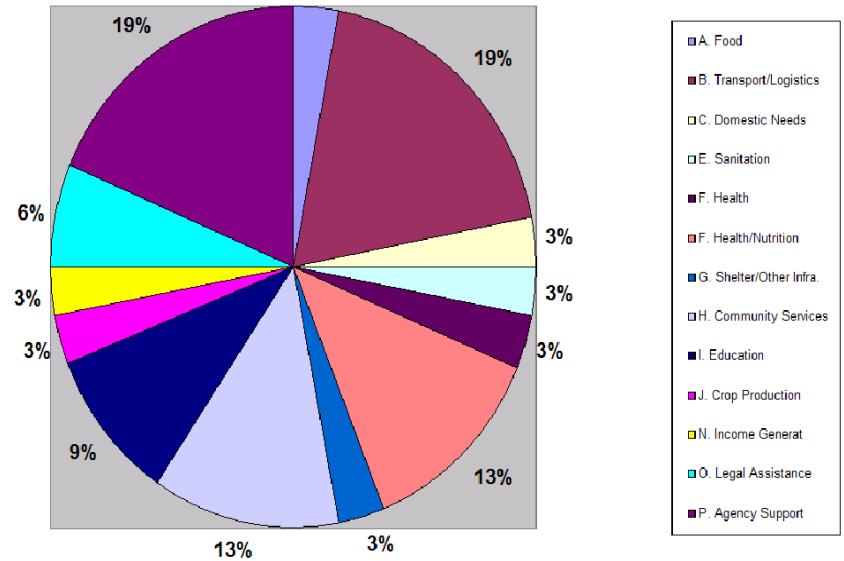
Buduburam Refugee Camp

Camp Population/Capacity: The current population in Buduburam camp is close to 42,000 and the camp has a full capacity of about

Establishment

Buduburam Settlement is located in the Central Region of Ghana, some one hour drive (35km) from Accra. The settlement, originally designed for 8,000 persons, accommodated some 15,000 refugees in the early nineties.

Between 1990 and mid-2000, UNHCR provided protection, care and maintenance to the refugees in the settlement.

In June 2000, all assistance to Liberian refugees was terminated as part of a regional policy. UNHCR's presence was re-established after two years, in mid-2002.

Basic facilities in Buduburam had fallen to a level far below international standards and indeed any acceptable norms. Since the resumption of community-based assistance in 2002, UNHCR has invested considerable effort and funding into raising standards in the areas of health, education, sanitation and security.
