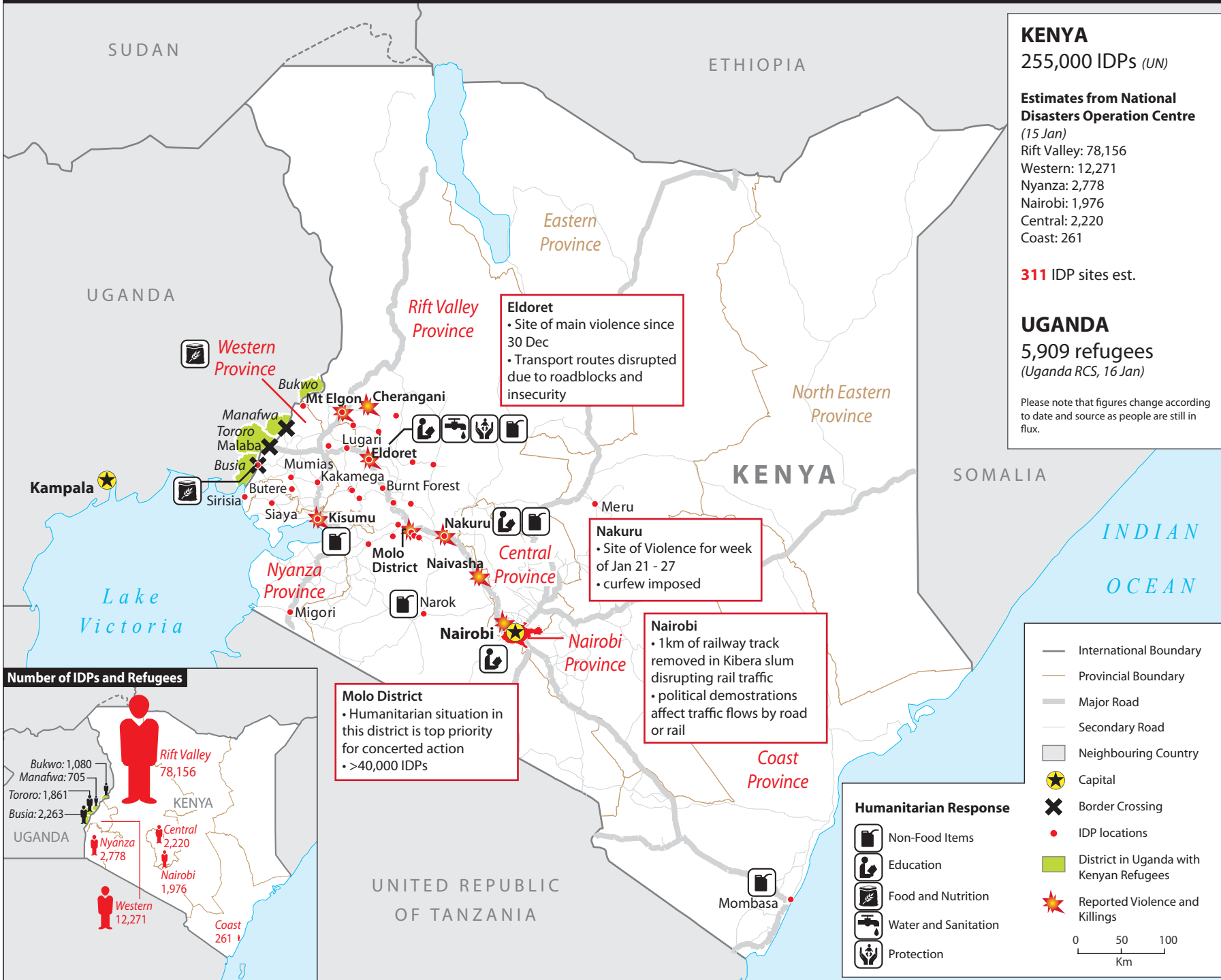


# Kenya: Displacement and Humanitarian Response (as of 28 Jan 2008)



## SITUATION

- Mediation efforts bring hopes of political resolution as former UN Secretary General brings President Kibaki and Orange Democratic Movement leader Odinga for first face-to-face meeting.
- Fighting erupts in Nakuru, home to thousands of IDPs, and in Naivasha, as gangs of youths from rival communities clash with each other and with police and military.
- Molo District considered the epicenter of violence and humanitarian needs.
